



Idioms - Money

to break the bank

to be REALLY expensive

Buying that apartment would break the bank

cost an arm and a leg

It is too expensive for my situation

We wanted to go skiing but everything costs and arm and a leg now

to pay through the nose

it costs a lot

I have to pay through the nose for a good education for my children

to splash out on something

to choose to spend a lot of money on something

I am going to splash out on a party for my anniversary

to be loaded

to have a lot of money

he can afford it, he's loaded

sitting on a small fortune

he will have a lot of money

Don't worry about him he is sitting on a small fortune

sitting on a goldmine

he has access to a large amount of income or money

He parents buying that factory means he is sitting on a goldmine now

to have money to burn

to have so much money you don't know what to do with it

He has money to burn since getting that new job



Idioms - Money

to be as poor as a church mouse

to have nothing

They are as poor as church mice, they will be struggling with the cost of living crisis

to be skint

to have no money

He is always skint at the end of the month

a Scrooge

a person who doesn't like spending and is miserable when others are happy (only interested in saving money)

He is such a Scrooge, doesn't even buy his daughter a gift for Christmas

a skinflint

doesn't like spending money

He's a really skinflint, he never buys a round

tight fisted

he has money but he won't part with it

He is rich because he is so tight fisted he never spends a penny
